

American Airlines to Move to Narita International Airport Terminal 2 (January 2007)



Currently Undergoing Remodeling

Beginning in January 2007, most of the **oneworld™** alliance member airlines will be located under one roof at Narita Airport Terminal 2. This will significantly reduce the time necessary for **oneworld** customers to connect on other **oneworld** alliance carrier airplanes. Terminal 2 is also the departure point for Japan Airlines flights, so our customers can take advantage of smoother, faster, and more convenient plane transfers.

Quicker Check-In

The new American Airlines location will feature refurbished check-in counter equipment, the installation of numerous automatic check-in kiosks utilizing the latest in travel technology, and soon a system that eliminates the need to inspect carry-on baggage before check-in.

New Lounge and Shopping Area

American Airlines will also build a new Admirals Club lounge in Terminal 2 for our First and Business Class guests and members. The new lounge will be 1,234 square meters—83% larger than the current lounge. Shopping areas located beyond the immigration area are also being expanded, giving you more options to shop prior to departure.

Rolling out a brand new menu this fall for our Japan - Transpacific flights



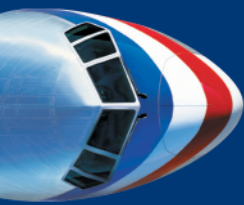
American Airlines has updated the Japanese entrées in First Class and Business Class to better fit the seasons and increase the amount of food offered. We will also be introducing new Western entrées in all three classes.

In Coach Class, we are introducing several new pasta entrées to help provide a heartier offering, and better satisfy both Western and Asian palates. The entrées include Chicken with Penne and White Wine Cream Sauce, and Shrimp with Basil Tortellini.

In First and Business Class the changes we will be offering are new filet entrées including Filet with Dijon Mustard Sauce and Filet with Chasseur Sauce and new chicken entrees. In Business Class, we have also updated the Sushi Appetizer for first service to better pair the offerings.

American Way celebrates 40th Anniversary



American Way magazine turns 40 this year, making it the longest continuously run magazine in the airline industry. The first issue, entitled "The American Way," numbered only 22 pages.

The success of American Way has spawned two other popular publications. Celebrated Living is a quarterly that is targeted at AA's premium class passengers, and American Airlines NEXOS, which is published six times a year in Spanish and Portuguese, aimed at Latin American customers. And the success of these magazines has led AA Publishing to spawn new business outside American.

Since then, as the only in-flight magazine to be published in-house, American Way has grown to an average issue size of 140 pages. It also has become one of the largest advertising vehicles in the industry.

Each issue of American Way is read by 1.4 million customers, according to MediaMark Research's Spring 2006 study. Those readers also look at the ads of major brands like Citibank, Hilton Hotels, and Sanyo, among hundreds of others.
